OCC at a Glance: How OCC is Structured

Regulators

As a Systemically Important Financial Market Utility (SIFMU), OCC operates under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), the U.S. Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC), and the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System.

Board of Directors

OCC is governed by a Board of Directors that includes Clearing Member representatives, exchange representatives, public directors, and a management representative.

Management Committee

Operating under the corporation's By-Laws and Rules, the Management Committee is led by the Chief Executive Officer, Chief Operating Officer, and other executive leadership responsible for the company's strategic direction, risk management oversight, and corporate culture. This includes creating and executing corporate strategy, establishing an overall plan for value creation, monitoring and reviewing business performance, and approving operating policies.
